
Find Comfort That Lasts

If possible, check the composition of sofa cushions by unzipping the backs. High-quality cushions contain foam and are wrapped in cotton or Dacron with an additional muslin protective inner cover. These extra layers add both comfort and durability to the cushions.

Consider Practical Colors

Most shoppers know to look for long-lasting sofa fabrics, including cotton weaves, microfiber, & acrylic, but the color of that fabric is equally important. Camel and auburn-colored pieces mask dirt and stains to help keep a sofa looking new, no matter what disasters life throws its way.

Dust Panels Provide Extra Protection

Known as dust panels, the thin sheets of wood placed between rows of drawers do more than help with organization. They add to the structural integrity of the dresser.

Glides Offer Smooth Operation

Full-metal glides, or the rails along the sides of drawers for opening and closing, offer the longest-lasting and smoothest operation for drawers. The highest quality glides have stops at the end to prevent drawers from falling out, even when they are opened with force.

DINING TABLE








The stability of a dining table rests on

its legs — literally. Take note of the way the legs attach to the table to ensure they will maintain a sturdy fit for years to come. Interlocking dovetail joints and single-key mortise and tenon joints are the most secure, durable options.

No matter what type of furniture it is,



A basic stability test is important for all types of furniture. Inspect the way a piece sits on the ground, and make sure all four corners touch evenly without rocking. Lift the piece at each corner, noting any squeaks or twists, and press down on each side to check for wobbles.
